**From April the 1<sup>st</sup> to May the 31<sup>st</sup> :** Tuesday to Sunday from 14:00 to 17:30

**From June the 1<sup>st</sup> to July the 9<sup>th</sup> :** Tuesday to Saturday from 10 :30 to 12:30 and from 14:00 to 17:30 - Sunday and public holidays from 14:00 to 17:30

**From July the 10<sup>th</sup> to August the 27<sup>th</sup> :** Monday to Saturday from 10.30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 2.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. - Sunday and public holidays from 2.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m.

**From August the 29<sup>th</sup> to September the 30<sup>th</sup> :** Tuesday to Saturday from 10:30 to 12:30 and from 14:00 to 17:30 - Sunday from 14:00 to 17:30

**From October the 1<sup>st</sup> to October the 31<sup>st</sup> :** Tuesday to Sunday from 2pm to 5.30pm

**From November the 2<sup>nd</sup> to November the 24<sup>th</sup> :** Monday to Friday from 2pm to 5.30pm
